#### **SUPERIOR COGNITIVE ABILITY**

A student referred for evaluation to determine gifted eligibility may participate in one or more of the following assessments. These assessments consider cognitive ability. All second and fifth grade students will participate in the CogAT test. Students scoring in the "screening" range will prompt a more in-depth examination of the child's abilities.

### **SPECIFIC ACADEMIC ABILITY**

A student referred for evaluation to determine gifted eligibility may participate in one or more of the following assessments. These assessments consider specific academic ability in the areas of mathematics; science; social studies; and reading/writing or both. Students will participate in the screening level of the assessment first.

Students scoring in the range of the  $90 - 94^{th}$  percentile on the screening will participate in further assessment. Any student scoring in the range of  $95^{th}$  percentile or above will be identified as gifted in the given academic area.
